12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.30 of Title 59, unless  
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A residential or commercial roofing contractor providing repairs  
17 or improvement services to be paid by an insured from the proceeds  
18 of a property or casualty insurance policy shall not, as an  
19 inducement to the sale or provision of goods or services to an  
20 insured, advertise or promise to pay, directly or indirectly, all or  
21 part of any applicable insurance deductible or offer to compensate  
22 an insured for providing any service to the insured. If a roofing  
23 contractor violates the provisions of this section, the insurer to  
24 whom the insured tendered the claim shall not be obligated to

1 consider the estimate prepared by the roofing contractor. Every  
2 roofing contractor shall provide a written notification of the  
3 requirements of this section with its initial estimate. The  
4 adjuster or insurer shall provide a written notification of the  
5 requirements of this section in the initial estimate relating to the  
6 claim.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
