If a roofing 23 contractor violates the provisions of this section, the insurer to 24

whom the insured tendered the claim shall not be obligated to

1	consider the estimate prepared by the roofing contractor. Every
2	roofing contractor shall provide a written notification of the
3	requirements of this section with its initial estimate. The
4	adjuster or insurer shall provide a written notification of the
5	requirements of this section in the initial estimate relating to the
